## **About our charity**

We support adults with learning disability, sometimes complex, to live more independently and to take control of their lives by providing a home, personal development, learning and inspiring work experiences. We operate as a commercial enterprise running a number of training projects which help to generate income to support our work including:

- Rare Breeds Centre: our 100 acre farm which is open to the public and attracts over 80,000 visitors per year.
- The Mariners': our busy tea room in Rye, East Sussex.
- Poulton Wood: our 28 acre woodland conservation project.
- Rainbow Gallery: a vibrant art project which welcomes over 100 artists.
- Plants and Produce: our horticulture project growing thousands of plants for sale to the public.





#### What can we offer you?

Located within the pretty village of Woodchurch, just south of Ashford in Kent, our 100 acre farm, with ample free parking, on-site restaurant and conferencing facilities, offers the perfect setting for corporate volunteering days! Our countryside location, with rolling hills and stunning woodland provides the chance to escape the office for a day and give back to the local community.
